It has been recorded by many artists, but is probably best known in a 1953 recording by Kay Starr. Harry Woods, who practised songwriting only as a sideline, wrote numerous 1920s standards, including: "When the Red, Red Robin (Comes Bob, Bob, Bobbin' Along)". "I'm Looking Over a Four Leaf Clover", and "Try a Little Tenderness".

He composed his songs on piano, despite the fact that he was born without fingers on his left hand.
